1 Summary

In the following the Technical Centre Assessment Committee (TCAC) will report on the 22nd B-centre evaluation round which was carried out between October 2023 and March 2024. This evaluation round uses the *CLARIN B-centre Checklist*¹ version 7.4.

For each centre that apply for assessment the TCAC:

- Recommends if the centre can be granted/re-granted the label as a CLARIN B-centre
- If needed, lists issues that must be improved before granting/re-granting the label
- Gives optional suggestions for improvements (section "Other remarks")

All centres had during the assessment process the option to clarify questions with the assessment committee and to comment on the points mentioned below in case the remarks or corresponding evaluation results are not agreed on.

For this round the following centres applied for the B-centre label:

- CLARIN.SI
- ORTOLANG

Summary of assessment:

- The CAC recommends granting the B-centre label upon renewal of the CTS to CLARIN.SI
- The CAC recommends granting the B-centre label to ORTOLANG once the outstanding AAI issue has been addressed.

Anything noted as "Other remarks" are not holding any granting back but are minor suggestions from the assessment committee.

The evaluation of B-centres will be valid for three years from the date the assessment is approved by the TCC. However, reassessment might be needed earlier if substantial changes in the requirements in the meanwhile are agreed upon within the TCC.
